SPRING IS IN THE AIR

TAKING THE BUS

Living in Forum has the advantage of being on the bus route. The OLIVE Metro Bus that stops at Four Seasons Shopping Center and across the street Westbound – if offers a great way to get to many places. Going East the Bus goes as far as the Delmar station (47 minutes) where it meets the MetroLink train. To the West the bus goes to Chesterfield Mall (12 minutes from Four Seasons) and Chesterfield City Hall. Along the way the Olive bus intersect swith 6 other bus routes. The cost for the bus is 1.65 (8.80 for 65+seniors with ID and children 5-12). The MetroLink train is \$2. Monthly pass is \$55 (less for seniors & children - \$27.50) - Metro Call-A-Ride provides curb-to-curb van service in St. Louis City and County and is restricted Monday-Friday to persons with disabilities who have registered to use the service but is open to the general public on Saturday and Sunday. We have been holding the book exchange at the clubhouse since November on the 2^{nd} Sunday afternoon.


